<p>-MEL- Clean Energy Engineering* Action: Approved</p> <p>-Please note, this pillar will be presented to the Senate Curriculum Committee on February 2, 2015. Before that date, the GNPCC needs an updated program proposal taking into account the Committee’s recommendations (below).</p> <p>-In addition to the comments below, please consider the general recommendations related to all pillar proposals that came as a result of the January 9, 2015 meeting of the GNPCC.</p> <p>-As noted previously, please add general information about the program in the “Proposed Calendar Entry.”</p> <p>-According to the proposal, the MEL-CEEN is set to replace the MEng- CEEN. The MEng- CEEN does not require industry experience, while the MEL-CEEN (new program) requires approximately 3 years of industry experience. Thus, the candidate pool will be different. Have the proponents considered whether this will limit the applicant pool? Especially considering that applicants would need to leave</p>	

career positions after 2-3 years to complete this program?

- Please include a statement in the Academic Calendar noting that the MEng- CEEN will no longer be offered. Note, you may want to submit this as a separate proposal to update the MEng-CEEN Academic Calendar listing (rather than including the information in the MEL- CEEN).
- As mentioned in the general comments, please provide more specific information about the required elective (noted in the Proposed Calendar entry) for the CEEN pillar. Please note whether the elective is in the business field or the Applied Science field. Please also provide information regarding how students can find a definitive list of the eligible electives.
- The Executive Summary should note that there is an existing MEng program that is closing.
- Any discussion in the proposal regarding the update/replacement of the MEng-CEEN, should be focused on closing the current MEng program and opening a new program (MEL- CEEN). The proposal should also note that sufficient time will be given to students who are currently enrolled in the MEng- CEEN program.
- As a reminder from the previous recommendations, please consider making the program goals more specific to each pillar.
- Please consider revising the sustainability section (2.5.5) to move away from the standard language that is used in all of the other pillar proposals. This pillar specifically deals with sustainability issues and may benefit from an expanded discussion of sustainability.
- The CEEN pillar proposal notes that the program does not allow “free electives.” Yet, the Proposed Calendar Entry states that students will be required to take an elective course. Please provide some clarification in the document surrounding the electives for this pillar.

- Please consider making APPP 506 (capstone) a 3-credit course. If the course needs to be 6-credits, an additional curriculum proposal can be presented at the time that the new pillar is proposed.
- Please provide a clear definition for “non-additive” credits.
- Within the program proposal, it would be beneficial to include specific information about the Pillar champions.
- If possible, please provide a record of the original curriculum consultation forms (and related feedback) that were exchanged between Applied Science and the consulted programs.

+Including the Following Course Changes:

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- As was mentioned in the previous recommendations, all of the proposed course changes (and the related syllabi) should provide additional information regarding student assessment on required activities.
- Please note, these courses are considered approved pending the receipt of updated 2-column Curriculum Change forms that take into account the Committee’s recommendations. The syllabi should be updated before the courses are delivered to students.

necessary for admissions to the program).
