3. Business Arising

- Approval of MHPCTL
- The Chair began by discussing his course of action regarding the MHPCTL during the off week (sending out a memo and moving forward with recommendations). The proponents agreed to make changes but the Committee will not be reviewing it again. The Chair made this decision in order to get MHPCTL to the SCC meeting next Wednesday (November 4, 2015).
- Lindsey outlined concerns over the differing levels of detail which exists between the MHPCTL Calendar language and its program proposal (regarding laddering). Concerns over granting the certificate and laddering it into the MA program were voiced. The Committee agrees that it will continue to work with proponents to find a resolution that is in line with proper admissions policy and if exceptions will/can be made.
- The Chair recommended to the Committee that clearer policy bet set out on behalf of the GCC in order to avoid "reputational damage". Any new policy created should bring certainty to the planning process for programs. It should outline that the majority of detail-specific review is done by GCC for SCC and if GCC's responsibilities are rushed, the majority of the review work will fall to the SCC.
- Discussion arose regarding what consequences the Committee could face if it decided not to approve proposals The Chair outlined that personal, reputational, and professional pressure/complaints are a real consequence of holding up or being seen as holding up proposals. The GCC's goal is to avoid reputational damage to individuals and the Committee as a whole.
- Concerns were raised over credibility of the Committee should proposals be pushed through by other forces at higher levels in the University.
- The decision was made for the GCC to create a consultation report for the MSDS program and, moving forward to have SCC review the consult as part of their regular meeting duties.
- Moving forward, the Committee has requested a formal discussion of the future of Committee responsibilities and the role that it will play in the larger Senate Curriculum approval process.

Master of Science in Data Science

- -Lindsey Kovacevic confirmed that the program will be administered by G+PS. As the process moves forward with Senate, the Provost/G+PS will determine administrative structure for the program. The program is being administered by G+PS for now, but this will likely change in the future.
- -The Committee recommends changing the acronym of the program to MScDS for formal credential and input into calendar.
- -Concerns were raised over the program completion time being 10 months of fulltime academic study. The Academic Calendar currently dictates that a Master's program must be the equivalent of 12 months of full-time study. Moving forward, G+PS will consult and discuss with Dean Susan Porter on recommended course of action.
- -The Committee recommends using the standard Academic Calendar language in place of the sentence starting with "In addition to completion..." on pg 12 of the proposal.
- -The Committee recommends clarifying the use of the term "block" in the last paragraph on pg 12 of the proposal.
 -In the table on Page 13, the Committee noted concerns over the cells in the lower left and right that detail A B C D according to the days of the week. The Committee requested some clarification on the meaning of A-D in the cells on this table.
- -For some courses, labs do not appear to be optional. The Committee has requested clarification that it will be

necessary to take labs in order to be successful in the overall course, even if labs are not graded. The Committee has requested additional written content to highlight how lab participation is an important component of the course despite not being directly graded. See Pg 14.

-On pg 16, the sentence that starts with "Given the unique nature of the 1-credit." appears to be in conflict with a statement in the Curriculum Consult provided by Dr. Kin Lo that some of these courses would be made available to Sauder. Please address this discrepancy.
-In the 2-column Curriculum Change form, under Proposed Calendar language, please include some information immediately under the "Program Requirements" heading noting that this program consists of 30 credits including a 6-credit capstone course.

General Comments about Course Syllabi:

- -The Committee recognized that all of the course syllabi followed a similar format. As a result, the suggestions below can be applied to all course syllabi. -Please note, the general changes have been noted in the first course syllabus as comments, and are not repeated for subsequent course syllabi. The annotated program proposal has been provided to the proponents for their reference.
- -Please ensure that the Faculty approval Date is included in the header on all 2-column Curriculum Change forms.
- -The Committee suggested including a summary of course information at the top of each syllabus (credits, contact hours, and the "block" that the course is delivered). This will make it easier to read and understand the syllabus upon initial review.
- -In courses where Peer Review is a component under Student Assessment, it should be clear that the instructors are

grading the peer reviews and that the students are not grading each other. It may also be useful to include a rubric for how the 10% grade is broken down. It was suggested that the rubric/additional information could be included in an appendix.

-In courses where Exams are a component of Student Assessment, please provide more detail on the general format of exams. It was recommended that an extra line be included describing the format as essay, short answer, multiple choice, etc.
-Under the Statement of Academic Integrity, please fix the error near the end of the statement which identifies the Advisory Committee on Student Discipline as the "Advisory Committee all Student Discipline." Please also replace "should" with "must" in the fourth sentence of the statement.
